

Food Truck Licence Applications must also include the following information:

- Certificate from Waterloo Region Public Health confirming truck has passed a sanitary inspection, valid for the year in which the licence is to be issued;
- if a propane or gas fired system is to be used, an inspection certificate by a Technical Standards and Safety Authority certified gas technician, valid for the year in which the licence is to be issued;
- a letter of approval from the Township Fire Chief, valid for the year in which the licence is to be issued;
- proof that the owner has obtained a minimum of two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) liability insurance for the operation of the food truck, valid for the year in which the licence is to be issued;
- if the food truck is to be located on lands not owned by the food truck owner, a letter from the owner of the property on which the food truck will be situated, authorizing the applicant to conduct such business from the property, valid for the year in which the licence is to be issued;
- copy of driver's licence(s) for all drivers of the food truck;
- provide a description of the food being served and how it will be prepared;
- details surrounding the containment and disposal of water supply and disposal, including grey water, grease disposal methods, and water disposal arrangements in a sanitary manner satisfactory to the Township.

Refreshment Truck – Class ‘A’ License Applications must also include the following information:

- Certificate from Waterloo Region Public Health confirming the truck has passed a sanitary inspection, valid for the year in which the licence is to be issued;
- a letter of approval from the Township Fire Chief, valid for the year in which the licence is to be issued;
- proof that the owner has obtained a minimum of two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) liability insurance for the operation of the refreshment truck, valid for the year in which the licence is to be issued;
- if the refreshment truck is to be located on lands not owned by the refreshment truck owner, a letter from the owner of the property on which the refreshment truck will be situated, authorizing the applicant to conduct such business from the property, valid for the year in which the licence is to be issued;
- copy of driver's licence(s) for all drivers of the refreshment truck;
- description of the food being sold.

Refreshment Truck – Class ‘B’ Licence Applications must also include the following information:

- Certificate from Waterloo Region Public Health confirming the truck has passed a sanitary inspection, valid for the year in which the licence is to be issued;
- proof that the owner has obtained a minimum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) liability insurance for the operation of the refreshment truck, valid for the year in which the licence is to be issued;
- if the refreshment truck is expecting to travel on lands not owned by the truck owner, a letter from the owner of the property on which the refreshment truck will be travelling, authorizing the applicant to conduct such business on the property, valid for the year in which the licence is to be issued;
- description of the food being sold.
